

Places of interest to visit while in Dublin



Kilmainham Gaol. [Kilmainham Gaol Museum | A monument to more than a century of Irish nationalism](#) one of Dublin's premier visitor attractions. Gives a great history of Ireland's fight for freedom. The guides are really excellent. Booking in advance is advisable.

Guinness Storehouse [Guinness Storehouse: Visit The Home of Guinness | Guinness® IE](#) Visit the home of Guinness and enjoy a pint in the gravity bar overlooking the city afterwards. This is a self-guided tour.



National Museum of Ireland: [Welcome to the National Museum of Ireland](#) Learn about Ireland's history, heritage and culture through a priceless collection of artefacts. Entry is free.

National Gallery of Ireland [Home | National Gallery of Ireland](#) Collection features some of the world's greatest artists, such as Picasso, Monet and Jack B Yeats. Entry is free.

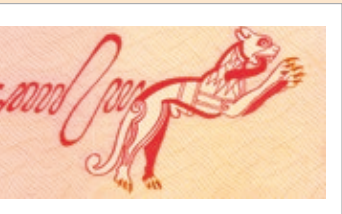

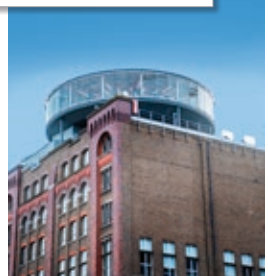

Book of Kells [Book of Kells Experience | Trinity College Dublin | Official Site](#) Explore Trinity's Old Library and view the world-famous Book of Kells.
